## JEWISH AMERICAN HEROES

In honor of July 4th and holidays such as Memorial Day, Veterans Day, etc., it is most interesting to find a book in the Temple Sinai Library entitled "Jewish Heroes of America" by Seymour "Sy" Brody. In his book honoring American Jewish Heroes, he has selected 101 heroes to write about. I have taken the time to break down these stories, and find that indeed our Jewish men and women were and are heroes. During the Revolutionary War, War of 1812, War with Mexico, and the Civil War, the Jewish men of that time were great heroes who fought bravely for the American cause. Men of World War I and World War II, the Korean War, Vietnam and those presently in the Baghdad theatre; our Jewish men carry on with the same tradition. Most recently in April, we lost two men formerly from Boca; on April 8th Major Mark Rosenberg and on April 22nd Major Stuart Wolfer.

In addition in the selection of Jewish American Heroes were Rabbis, Statesmen, Zionist Patriots, Scientists, Inventors, Entertainers, Sportsmen and of course, Women. We all can be very proud of the contribution our Jewish Heroes have made yesterday, today and will make tomorrow. As we celebrate holidays throughout the year, let us take a moment or two to say "thank you" to all who served in the armed forces and who are serving today. We can also remember the one and only duel hero, Astronaut Ilan Ramon. Currently we have an additional American-Jewish hero, Astronaut Gregory Chamitoff, who flew in space on May 31st, taking with him a pewter mezuzah. As he said "to remind him of his religion and family." I would like to salute my two heroes, Ruben Snitkin and Martin Nadler, who served so gallantly in WWII.

## RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

Dear Religious School Families,

I hope you have had a happy, meaningful, and safe summer so far. On Sunday, August 17<sup>th</sup>, we will be having an “Open House” for new families, and an additional day for those of you who have not yet registered your children for the 2008-2009 school year, to do so. Please feel free to bring a friend or neighbor who might be interested in Religious education for their children. As you know, we are a full service (B’nei Mitzvah and Confirmation) Temple and Religious School that meets on Sundays only, which for busy families, might be very convenient. Our wonderful teachers will be attending a special Jewish Education Conference on Sunday, August 24<sup>th</sup>, and the following Sunday is “Labor day.” Hence, this year, Religious School starts on Sunday, September 7<sup>th</sup>. On this first day of school, we will open with a special family orientation. All families and their children will be together in the sanctuary for this orientation. We will begin the orientation at 9:30 a.m., our usual beginning time.

At the orientation, our faculty will introduce themselves, and give you a brief outline of what your children will learn and experience this coming year. We will distribute important information, like the updated school calendar and family education program dates. We will also review the Parent handbook, and some important changes therein, and lastly, have an open questions and answers session to make sure that all is clear and understood. We are so excited to have the largest Confirmation class in years, and are planning a special trip to the Washington Holocaust Museum for them. The cost to the families should be minimum, for we are hoping to raise sufficient funds so that we can provide this ongoing experience every year to all of our children as they move into their Confirmation year. (As we all realize, it is important that our children’s Jewish education not stop at 7<sup>th</sup> grade. This is why we are investing faculty, time, and funds into this important phase of our children’s Jewish education – and Jewish Identity.)

I’m also hoping that at this orientation we will all meet our new Rabbi, Rabbi Gregory Kanter. (In the past year, both Rabbi Agin and Rabbi Kanter, who were both interim Rabbis, conducted meaningful and special B’nei Mitzvot, and helped our children called to the Torah to shine!)

I hope to see you all very soon.

## **PRESIDENTS' MESSAGE**

This year has been difficult and challenging for Temple Sinai. We lost two dedicated and active members – Mark London, Co-President and Albert Wagner, past Executive Vice President. We miss them and will miss all they did for Temple Sinai. Despite this loss and the departure of Rabbi Wender and Cantor Werby, we are truly proud of the way the Membership has pulled together and gone forward with so many accomplishments. Our people - all of you - are our strength and are the foundation for our growth and excellence. We applaud our Cantorial Soloist, Margaret Schmitt, for the way she has taken the reins during a difficult period. She has developed our regular Choir and introduced our Youth Choir, who performed at Mizner Park during the Israel 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration. We also have to commend the search committee, led by Sid Wartel, for the great job they did in selecting Rabbi Gregory Kanter for consideration as our new Rabbi.

There are many other accomplishments which are worthy of mention. You surely have noticed the resurfaced and re-striped parking lot with a new wheelchair ramp, updated handicapped parking and seven new parking spaces. Security concerns have been addressed with the installation of a security camera system that covers the total building and is backed up by video that records whatever the cameras see. Increased lighting in the parking lot has added to this security. Thanks to a generous donation, new lighting has been installed on the stage. And the Brotherhood and Sisterhood joined to donate a generator to allow kitchen facilities to be used during a hurricane. A project that will bear fruit this fall is the new youth lounge that is now under construction. Unused rooms will be rented out to bring additional income to the Temple.

The programs created by the adult education committee were truly an educational experience we can be proud of. For many who attended the classes in Hebrew literacy, the Beauty of Judaism, Hebrew for Beginners, and Yiddish conversation, their love for the languages of Judaism was expanded. There were many guest speakers on Mondays, Thursdays and Sundays and Tea in the Afternoon programs offered a wide variety of educational opportunities that included Current events, Book Reviews, American History, and lectures by highly acclaimed Jewish scholars in many areas.

Adult B'nai mitzvah classes created an emotionally filled Shabbat on December 8, when five women were called to the Torah for their Bat Mitzvahs.

We can also be proud of the noteworthy work our Temple has done in the community among those who are less fortunate than most of us. Thousands of non-perishable food items were collected and delivered to two local Food Pantries. Those in need also received school supplies, clothing and shoes, used eyeglasses, and personal toiletries that we collected. We also sent hundreds of teddy bears, other stuffed animals and Get Well cards to sick and injured children at two Israeli hospitals. And right here at home, our sick and homebound congregants also received baskets of Bimah flowers.

Our Religious Activities Committee did an outstanding job in coordinating services with interim Rabbis and Lay leadership. In addition, there were a number of Family Shabbat

programs, a successful Tot Shabbat program, an outdoor Tu B'Shevat morning service, and the organization of a Bikur Cholim group.

Fundraising is vital to our financial health and we had a number of successful fund raising events this year sponsored by our Ways and Means Committee. The Book of Remembrance/Yiskor booklet, the Dinner Dance, journal and silent auction, a Erev Rosh Hashanah Dinner and Passover Seder -- all were important. Your support for these events is appreciated.

A new Member incentive program was developed by our Membership Committee to involve the entire congregation in recruiting new Members. They also adopted programs in conjunction with our Religious School to attract young people with children.

The membership retention committee ran many new and creative events including two Shabbat Dinners – A Blue Jeans BBQ & a Purim Heroes Dinner. There also was a Schmooze Party featuring Human Bingo and they conducted a Havdallah service and reception for new members.

We can also be proud of our Religious School. Family Education Programs for Sukkot, A Holocaust Memorial Trip, ChanukkaRama, Purim carnival, and Model Seder were very successful due to the participation of volunteers and Lay Leaders. In addition to our monthly family service, we had two "Early" 5:30 p.m. services, which were very well attended by the younger kids. With seven B'nai Mitzvah this year and 12 already scheduled for the year to come, we are very pleased with the progress of our school.

Brotherhood and Sisterhood continue to be a major source of revenue for the Temple. They sponsor Shows, Dances, Breakfasts, Onegs, and other fund raising activities that help to fund important projects.

Our Temple publicity, done professionally, has gotten us more free, positive exposure than we have had in many years. Our Website has become an important source for information, both for Members and prospective Members. We have also used e-mail extensively to communicate Temple happenings.

A special thank you to our outgoing Officers and Board of Trustee members for your dedication and contributions.

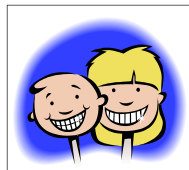

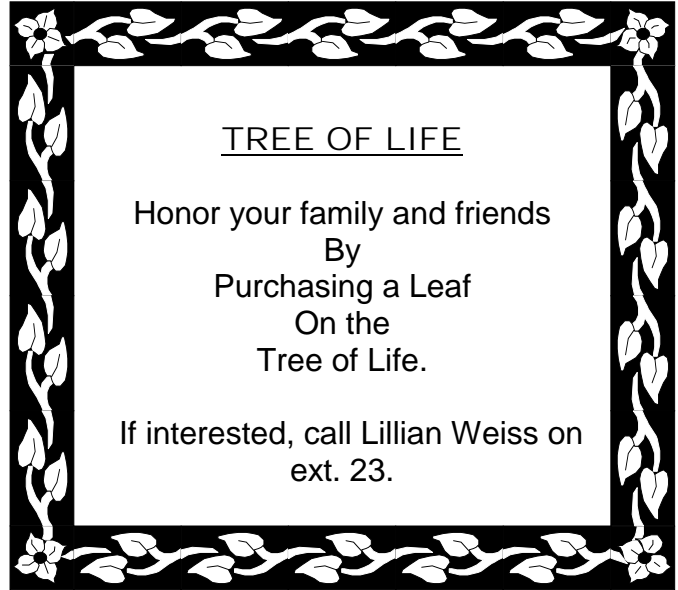
## THANK YOU

Dear Friends,

Many, many thanks to all of you who wished me a good vacation trip to England. It was very good, but much, much too short. I did manage to cram a lot into 8 short days, including two musical shows, the Chelsea Flower Show (something I had wanted to do for years), several walking tours, Portobello market, the Rose Garden in Regent's Park, several museums and lots of shopping-including shopping for music. I also visited with friends in London and Yorkshire, spent an afternoon in York, did a day trip to see a stately home and garden in the Lake District, and found a good new restaurant in Chinatown. Whew! Unfortunately I could not do one of the things I had most wanted to do- a walking tour of the old Jewish quarter in the East End of London. 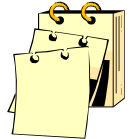

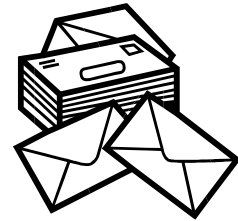
