To learn that there are persons who love them dearly, but simply do not know how to express or show their feelings. To learn that money can buy everything but happiness. To learn that two people can look at the same thing and see it totally different. To learn that a true friend is someone who knows everything about him or her.....and likes him or her anyway. To learn that it is not always enough that they are forgiven by others, but that they have to forgive themselves. People will forget what you said. People will forget what you did....but people will never forget how you made them feel.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

Dear Religious School Families,

This has been a challenging year for all of us, and I think we have come through quite well. We've established early family services, for the younger families, which went very well, with high attendance. Our Family Holiday programs were very successful: Sukkot, ChanukaRama, Purim Carnival, and, just recently the Family Model Seder. This year, we all participated in one Model Seder. We had over a hundred participants, and some of our families brought along their grandparents, which was very special. The children did all of the fun readings (we used part of a Dr. Seuss Hagaddah), while Margaret, our Cantorial Soloist, led us in the traditional Seder songs and blessings. Overall, it was a very successful, and enjoyable family program. We are now in the final few weeks of school, and have two major family events coming up. The first is the special Israel Independence 60th Birthday family Program. Much like the ChanukaRama, we will rotate through several meaningful and fun experiences about Israel. There will be the traditional Israel song and dance, a creative art project, an Israel Jeopardy type of challenging game, an informative Youth and Israel DVD presentation, and, of course, the tasting of traditional Israeli foods: Falafel, Pita Bread, Chumus, Tahinah, and Israeli salad. We hope to see all of you come and celebrate this special birthday of Israel. This year, the Teacher Appreciation Family service will be on Saturday eve, May 10th, beginning at 6:00 pm, with dinner. There will be a short Havdallah service (15 minutes, at most), which will be followed by our traditional honoring of, and presentations to, our wonderful teachers. After dinner, Havdallah, and Teacher Presentations, there will be movies, fun and games for all the family. This entire event is organized and run by our temple Youth, under the guidance of Shanna St. John, our wonderful Youth Director. Please make it a point of coming to honor our teachers and future teachers (the Youth) of Temple Sinai. Registration for the 2008-2009 Religious School year began on Sunday, April 27th (after we got back from Spring Break), and I hope that by the time you get this Tablet article, you have already registered for next year. If not, registration goes through May 11th, the last day of religious School, which will end with a graduation ceremony, where certificates and awards will be given out. The Awards ceremony will be the last hour of school, beginning at 11:30 am. Please come into the Sanctuary and be seated by 11:15 am. Each child in the school will be receiving a special certificate, and many children will be getting awards. Photos will be taken of the entire event. Don't forget to bring your digital camera, too! On Sunday Evening, June 8th, at 7:30 pm, Jillian Montague will be honored with Confirmation. We are so very proud of Jillian, and hope that all of you can come and honor her, at this very special milestone of Jewish Life. Lastly, I'd like to thank all the members of the devoted Religious School Committee for their hard work and commitment in making this year a great year of learning and fun for the children and families of the school.

As we move forward to a new year, I know that we will only go from strength to strength, and wish all of you a safe, meaningful, and fun summer vacation!

On behalf of myself, my family and the Temple Sinai membership, we offer our prayers and condolences to the London Family. Mark will truly be missed.

As we approach the end of one season and with preparations already begun for the High Holidays, we look forward to the next season. Looking back, we have to conclude that the challenges of the past few months have made us a stronger congregation thanks to the support of our members.

The search for a new Rabbi has been our prime concern and we are happy to report that the search is progressing. In the interim, all of our commitments to life cycle events are being honored. As necessary, we have made arrangements to assure B'nai Mitzvah training, religious services, funeral and shiva services without interruption.

With a heavy heart, I have to report that our acclaimed pre-school will be closing at the end of the current school year. This was forced upon us by a set of circumstances beyond our control. With the graduation of the current class, our school would be left with only 13 students and little likelihood of increasing enrollment because of the new PVK Programs sponsored by the government. The latter provides for pre-school at so low cost that we could not possibly compete.

Every cloud, it is said, has a silver lining. Our silver lining is the way we are planning to utilize the space formerly devoted to the preschool. We will create a supervised Youth Center for our teens and other Jewish teens in the community with the hope that these children, enjoying the use of our facilities, will influence their parents to become members of Temple Sinai. Surplus space will be rented out to offset any loss of income.

With all the recent challenges, we have to commend our congregants for the way you have come together to overcome all obstacles. This is true of our younger congregants who have presented fresh, new ideas and are actively participating along with our long term members who have come forward to help shoulder the burdens of growth. Rabbi Agin, in his last sermon of the season, described "*The Magic of Temple Sinai*" as our warm, welcoming congregation. He is right.

Our various committees are busy planning programs for next year. You can help by joining these committees, participating in the many activities offered and also by volunteering to assist in the Temple office. Please let us know how you would like to help.

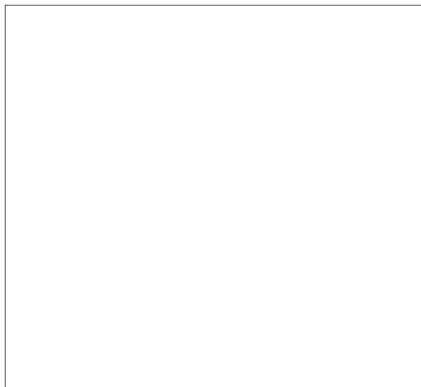

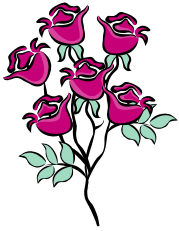

SOCIAL ACTION

Dear Temple Sinai Family,



It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as Vice President of Social Action for the past four years. Our Committee, with the Temple's support, has achieved many wonderful goals. Our mission has always been to provide support in a variety of ways to our local community and Israel, and create positive interfaith collaborations.

We have collected thousands of non-perishable food items to benefit two local Food Pantries. We have collected and sent hundreds of teddy bears, other stuffed animals and Get Well cards to provide comfort and love to sick and injured children at two Israeli hospitals. We have sponsored four annual Mitzvah Day events, which allowed all of us to come together to perform acts of kindness, collect needed items and make hundreds of peanut butter sandwiches. We have delivered baskets of Bimah flowers to sick and homebound congregants. We have collected Friday evening Tzedakah to benefit the Religious School Scholarship Fund and other worthwhile agencies. We have collected school supplies, clothing and shoes, used eyeglasses and personal toiletries for those in need. We have sponsored yearly Brotherhood collaborations with other Houses of Worship and invited their Clergy to share comments on the strong relationships between Jews and Christians.
