Through music, crafts and storytelling, they are helping parents and grandparents become better able to raise their children with a sense of their Jewish identity. Temple Sinai members welcome inter-faith and unaffiliated families to join together for this intergenerational mitzvah project to sustain Jewish continuity.

On March 31st, a dozen youngsters assembled to learn about Passover and create matzah covers for the seder table. Prior to the conclusion of the Shabbat morning service, the Rabbi and Cantor welcomed the children and their family members as the children proudly marched in procession, carrying their plush torahs.

RABBI'S MESSAGE

On Tuesday evening, May 22nd, beginning at the special early time of 7:30 p.m., our congregation will celebrate the third great pilgrimage festival of the Hebrew calendrical year.

Shavuot is identified in our Jewish liturgy as **zeman matan torateinu**, "the season of the giving of our Torah." According to tradition, the Ten Commandments were given to the Children of Israel at Mount Sinai on Shavuot. Today it is customary for the entire congregation to stand throughout the reading of the Ten Commandments on Shavuot. It is as if we are both reenacting the Sinaitic Revelation, and at the same time indicating our own ongoing role in the acceptance of the Torah by our Jewish People, in every generation.

Accordingly, Reform Judaism has long associated the beautiful ceremony of Confirmation with the Festival of Shavuot. The purpose is to encourage the intellectual and spiritual growth of our young people, to strengthen the bonds between them and the Israelites who received the Revelation at Sinai, and to stimulate their love for G-d and their Jewish people.

We recognize that it may not be convenient to attend a worship service on a Tuesday evening. But Reform Judaism today is no longer simply a "religion of convenience." Rather, it is becoming more and more, a "**Religion of Commitment.**" We observe major festivals on their proper dates, along with the rest of our co-religionists, in the spirit of **K'lal Yisrael**, the community of all Israel. So, please do come along and

celebrate with **Samantha Adams** on this uniquely significant and indeed, sacred, occasion. If this wonderful young Confirmand is willing to make the effort, won't you please join with us, dear friends?

Dear Religious School Families,

First, a few words to tell you how proud I am to be a part of Temple Sinai. It has been a wonderful year, in many ways! Some of the highlights have been the Family High Holy Days services, and monthly Family Shabbat service, where you all shined, the Consecration ceremony and Chanukkah/Rama Family event, the Purim Megillah and Purim Carnival, that you made happen, the fun Model Seders, and the fantastic Family Picnic, which I consider to be the cream on the cake, and which was planned and organized by you, the dedicated parents!

Looking back, we had a lot of fun! But next year, I know is going to be better. We are growing, and moving in the right direction. Our teachers are simply superb, our education program is cutting edge, with computer interactive and internet Hebrew review and remedial assistance, for all students, including the often neglected Special Needs kids in the community, and our kids come in on Sundays smiling, and leave with happy faces, which is the real measure of a Religious School education. Finally, our parents, "yes you!" stepped forward to assist, contribute, organize events, and help us grow, by spreading the word. Parents, you brought in 70% of all the new families this year! We, the faculty and staff of the Religious School, thank you for your confidence and support.

As the school year draws to a close, we have several significant events, and also some important administrative items to wrap up. First, the **"Teacher Appreciation Shabbat," on Friday, May 4th, with a Family Dinner at 6:00 pm, and the Family Service following at 7:00 pm. I sincerely hope that all our wonderful Religious School families will join us for this final Family Dinner, and special tribute to our caring teachers.** Parents and grandparents are all welcome. A dinner reservation flyer will be available until the beginning of May. We will need an accurate idea of how many children and adults will be attending the week before the event. Please respond immediately to the requests for this information. Please make out all checks to Temple Sinai (On subject line: Family Dinner reservations).

We began REGISTRATION FOR THE 2007-2008 SCHOOL YEAR on Sunday, April 29th, and you should have registered at that time. If not, please make sure to register BEFORE the end of the school year. (IMPORTANT NOTE: ALL REGISTRATIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY THE LAST DAY OF THE 2006-2007 RELIGIOUS SCHOOL YEAR – SUNDAY, MAY 6TH, 2007.)

If you are registering on Sunday, May 6th, please take your child to class, and go to the Finkelstein Hall. There will be a team of people there ready to help you complete the registration process.

Also, if you have family or friends who are interested in joining our school, please bring them along with you, and we will let their kids join the classes with their friends, while their parents join the temple, and register their children for next year.

There have been some school tuition policy changes that will be implemented for the 2007-2008 school year: New temple members will receive a 50% tuition discount for each child for the first year of school, and a 25% discount for each child for the second year of school. Registration and book/activities fees remain the same, and must be paid by all attending Religious School children.

On behalf of the faculty and staff of the Religious School, and the Temple lay leadership, let me wish you all a wonderful and safe Summer Break, and hope to see you all back on Sunday, August 26th for the first day of the 2007-2008 Religious School year.

You can understand the depth of my love for Robert Goodman and his Faga, who has helped him with all of his endeavors.

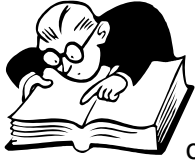
We will be seeing him only on occasion from now on. May he enjoy his retirement and stay well.
