A most important holiday.

When asked about Jewish holidays, many will easily recall the High Holy Days of Rosh Hashanah, Chanukah and Passover. Often overlooked is Shavuot. Yet, it is a very significant holiday.

The word, "Shavuot" means "weeks" . . . the weeks it took for our ancestors to travel from Egypt to Mount Sinai where they received the Torah. That alone should make it one of the most important events in Jewish history.

Our Shavuot service on Tuesday, May 18th begins with a light snack at 6:30 PM. It will break into three important study sessions. The Wednesday morning service begins at 10:00 AM and includes reciting Yizkor.

The dinner just before services on Erev Rosh Hashana and the break-the fast at the conclusion of Yom Kippur has proved so successful that it is being repeated this year.

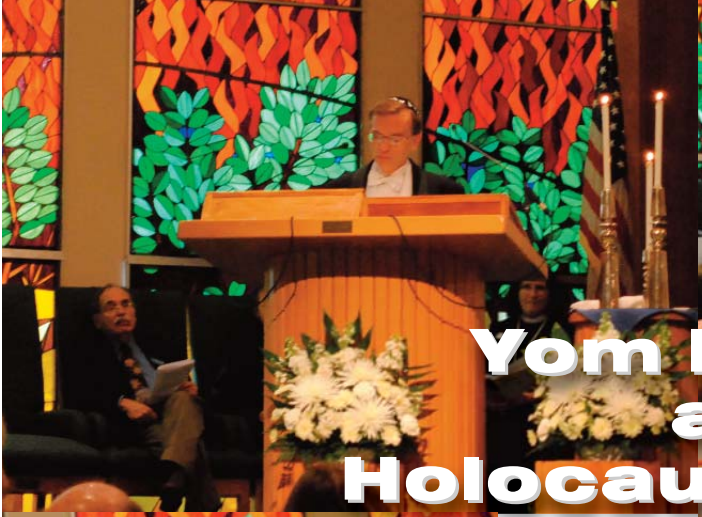

Dear Friends,

I hope everyone reading this was present for our Yom HaShoah Erev Shabbat service. I was absolutely thrilled and very proud of the music we presented that evening. The singing of our Shabbat Choir and the St. Paul's Choir was glorious- 43 voices filling our Sanctuary with joy and beauty. Our instrumentalists were wonderful. A special thank you to Gareth Johnson, who came to play his violin for us as a gesture of friendship and respect for the message we presented that night. He is an outstanding musician, and I hope he will return to Temple Sinai very soon.

The greatest possible thanks and praise go to Dr. Keith Paulson-Thorp for all the work he did in preparing the music for that night. In addition to directing the choirs and instrumentalists and playing the organ, Keith also designed and created the program- a really overwhelming amount of work.

In May our second adult B'nai Mitzvah class will celebrate a very special day in their lives. The class will lead Shabbat services on both Friday May 7th and Saturday May 8th. This group of six very dedicated people has been working extremely hard to prepare for this day. Please be there to support them and share in their joy.



Two weeks later on May 21st, our Erev Shabbat service will be led by our Confirmation class. This is another big day for our students, our congregation and for me- it happens to be my birthday! Just a few days earlier we will celebrate Shavuot with a special service/study session on May 18th and a morning Festival service with Yizkor on the 19th.

June will be the really big event for our entire congregation. The second Friday of June will be the beginning of our transition to our new prayer book, the Mishkan Tifilah. Although we have been using these prayer books for the morning service since last summer, we will begin using it for Erev Shabbat services the last Friday in June. The 2nd and 3rd Fridays will provide an interesting (and fun) transition from old to new, as we use the 1950's prayer book for one service, then use the 1970's prayer book for the next service, and finally begin using our newest prayer book.

Rabbi and I are working on special services in the style of each of these time periods. The entire congregation can join in this idea, dressing and following the social customs used at those time periods. The music will also be appropriate for each era. It will be fun, but also a good way to see how traditions have changed over the past 60 years.

On Friday April 9th, 800 people, members and guests, filled our sanctuary to experience an incredible Friday night service followed by a Cantata memorializing Yom Ha Shoah, Holocaust Remembrance.

Friday night's service was led by Rabbi Greg Kanter and Cantorial Soloist Margaret Schmitt. Temple Sinai's choir was joined by the voices of St. Paul's choir to produce an amazing sound. At the end of the service, the Holocaust survivors of our congregation were honored. As each survivor's name was mentioned and he or she stood, a candle was lit by a student from our Religious School on the six candle Menorah which represented the six million. As the first part of the program ended, our guest violinist played the theme from Schindler's List which served as a segue into the Cantata part of our program.

The Cantata section of the program was directed by our own Dr. Keith Paulson -Thorp. The program consisted of songs, narratives and poems written by people who had lived and died in the camps. It is quite impossible to begin to say how this program affected all of us who were in attendance. We were moved to tears. There wasn't a sound in the congregation. At one point, a slide show was shown of scenes from the camps – of families, of children. It was almost too much to view and yet so important to see and remember, and to remind the world.

Words cannot do justice to the incredible, yet difficult experience, of sitting in the sanctuary with our brothers and sisters, listening to the poignant songs, hearing the spoken words of those who had been there. It brought back memories. We were moved. There were many tears shed.

We cannot explain what it meant to be part of bringing this program to Temple Sinai. If in reading this, you missed the program, we are sorry.

This special evening was put together in only three weeks. A few of our members saw the production at St. Paul's church and were so moved by it, that they

instantly decided that this was something that our members and all people should see.

Quickly membership came forward to work hand in hand to help, to do whatever had to be done to make this event happen, not only happen, but to run perfectly. The lesson in this shows that if we all work together we can accomplish anything.

We went to the Board of Directors to get approval to do such a program. They readily agreed and we came up with three goals: (1) To bring this important Cantata to our members and community; (2) To get new people to come and hopefully join our Temple; and, (3) To raise money to continue to be able to bring more presentations such as this to Temple Sinai.

The results of our efforts produced the following:

Our members and members of the community had many kind words and thanked us profusely. Many new faces who came to Temple Sinai for the first time showed some interest in becoming members. Hopefully this will materialize in the weeks to come.

The financial end of this evening was not as productive. We raised over \$7,000 from sponsors. This did not cover the whole cost. Unfortunately, the donations collected that evening totaled only \$600.

As Co-Presidents of Temple Sinai, we were very proud to share this Shabbat Service and Cantata with the Jewish community. We hope with financial support we will be able to bring more of these types of programs to our members and the community.

At the risk of leaving out some names, let us say "A Sincere Thank You" to all of you who helped in making this program possible. You know who you are. We applaud and appreciate your efforts.

A special thanks to the musicians, clergy and choir of St. Paul's, as well as to Rabbi Kanter, Margaret and Keith.

Tears rolled down the cheeks of many. Who could not be moved by the poignant story unfolding? Survivors of the horrors of the concentration camps, each with his own haunting memories came to light a candle.

The service was one of remembrance. Let us remember. Better yet, let us not forget the horrors that befell Jews and others. It is a story to be repeated and repeated, year after year, month after month, week after week and day after day so our children, their children and their children's children shall always remember and never let it occur again.

The Holocaust Cantata told the story in words and music. Consider how incredible it was that those suffering the pains of the concentration camps were able to create music and express in words the horrors they

endured so that we will always remember.

It's said that there are four seasons in Florida; Early Summer, Summer, Late Summer and Next Summer. And

though our part-time members from the north have departed, our programs continue.

We hope you attend our adult B'nai Mitzvah when several of our congregants are called to the Torah. The celebration will begin the evening of Friday, May 7th and continue when our adult B'nai Mitzvah are called to the Torah on Saturday morning, May 8th.

And upcoming on Tuesday, May 18th, we will have our Tikkun Leil Shavuot. This study session, which traditionally begins at midnight and lasts all night, will, at Temple Sinai, begin with a nosh at 6:45 pm, followed by services at 7:30 pm and three break-out study sessions from 8:30 pm - 9:30 pm.

Shavuot is considered in Talmud as a concluding holiday, closely linked to Passover. It is referred to as Atzeret (conclusion). While not in the Bible, the Talmud associates Shavuot (an agricultural holiday), with G-d's

revelation of Torah on Mt. Sinai. It is a time of Jewish affirmation. The Book of Ruth is traditionally read during services.

Reform Judaism introduced the confirmation ceremony into the Shavuot Service (around 19th Century) and so our young confirmands (ages 13-16) confirm their allegiance to the Jewish way of life at this time.

Here's How It Works

1. Check the list of local outlets participating in the Gift Program.

There are more than 500 stores, restaurants and others nationally. We have a shorter list of local outlets for you to choose from.

2. You order your gift card(s).

From the lists, determine which Gift Card(s) you want. Use the order form. The amount you pay is the actual face amount of the card (no premium payment is added). Cards are on sale at the Temple after Friday night Shabbat services and during religious school hours on Sunday. Or, you can mail your order to the Temple or drop it off at the office.

3. Submit your order with payment.

Cards must be paid for with check or cash. No credit cards. Checks should be made out to Temple Sinai. Temple Sinai will get a per-

centage of the face amount of the card. The percentages vary.

4. We order the Gift Cards on Monday.

We will check all orders for accuracy. Orders received with proper payment are sent to our supplier on Monday.

5. Your Gift Cards will be ready for pick-up on the following Friday.

Cards may be picked up after Friday night Shabbat Services, on Sunday during Religious School hours or whenever the office is open. You will be required to check that your order has been filled properly and sign for it.

6. Use the card as you would any gift card.

Shop as you would normally using the card for payment. If the items you purchase are less than the face amount of the card, the difference will remain as a balance.


